<p align="center">Women's Ice Hockey Dead and Quiet Periods</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • November 7-10, 2022 (Monday through Thursday of the initial week for the fall signing of the National Letter of Intent). • March 16-20 (noon), 2023 (the day prior to the National Collegiate Women's Ice Hockey Championship to noon on the day after the match). • Quiet Period: Monday prior to the American Hockey Coaches Association Convention through May 31.
<p align="center">Men's Soccer Dead and Quiet Periods</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • November 7-10, 2022 (Monday through Thursday of the initial week for the signing of the National Letter of Intent). • December 9-11, 2022 (Friday through Sunday of the NCAA Division I Men's Soccer Championship). A coaching staff member may attend an event conducted in conjunction with and in the host city of the championship. • Quiet Period: December 23-25, 2022.
